1. Chairperson's introduction and welcome

Chair welcomed everyone to the SAVID AGM on Zoom.

The Chair reported that all SAVID member villages were active and that in 2022 SAVID as a body had also been successful within the Kesgrave, Rushmere St Andrew, Martlesham, Carlford and Fynn Valley Community Partnership Road Safety Forum, with both funding and impact during the recent Road Safety Week. Andrew Jolliffe, Communities Officer ESC was thanked for his support.

CH and JW both observed that coordination efforts between member villages, particularly along shared 'corridors' do at times have an impact on reducing speeding.

DC advised that speed data is available for all Suffolk roads, via SATNAV data and recommended that this be overlaid on a map of the SAVID area annually to assess trends.

David Chenery, Safety and Speed Management Engineer, SCC was thanked, on the occasion of his retirement, for his counsel, help and time in supporting SAVID since it was founded in 2015.

The AGM closed at 7pm
