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SAVID Community Group Meeting

Wednesday 7th October 2020 6:30pm

Held remotely via Zoom

Minutes

1. Chairperson's introduction and welcome.

Chair welcomed everyone to the SAVID group meeting on Zoom.

2. To receive apologies from people not attending.

Present:

Pauline Procter (Chair, Tuddenham), Colin Hedgley (Treasurer, Great Bealings), Bob Crouch (Grundisburgh), Martin Lyne (Charsfield), Ian Ransome (Little Bealings joined 18:55), Ted Herrington (Playford), Tanya Fosdick (Advisor), Andrew Jolliffe ESC Communities Officer, Geoff Caryer (Grundisburgh PC) and the Secretary.

3. Public participation session: Chair asked that this item be used to allow members to report and update since the last meeting. This was agreed.

Colin Hedgley reported that Great Bealings and Little Bealings SID posts were being pursued. Abuse from motorists had been minimal towards the CSW volunteers recently which was pleasing.

Bob Crouch and Geoff Caryer reported that in Grundisburgh there had been few bad reactions to CSW.

Pauline Procter reported that CSW had been receiving mixed reactions from motorists as usual. i.e. no change. An FOI request had been submitted to obtain recent Speed Data Recorder (SDR) results.

Ted Herrington reported that had not received the invitation to this meeting. Secretary apologised and would ensure that he would receive all future correspondence. It was reported that chasing the posts request made to SCC had resulted in confirmation that they were on the SCC waiting list.

Andrew Jolliffe reported that ESC Community Partnership had agreed their priorities in September 2019 included Road Safety and Sustainable Transport. A small contribution had been made towards the 30mph speed issues in Boot Street. The next meeting was in November.

Feedback had been received from local residents about improvements for cyclists and footpaths. Martin Lyne reminded the meeting of the dangers to cyclists and pedestrians where no pavement exists.

SDR FOI requests to the Police for the 85th percentile data were discussed which had it's challenges. Tanya Fosdick advised that SCC Highways can have conflicting priorities with the Police who had separate remits and further issues of high Police staff turnover. Martin Lyne advised the meeting of the issues as he saw them which were:

- It is very hard to get the SDR data
- Individuals who see the data have no authority to act on it
- Decisions were wanting on Police resources and/or The Suffolk Road Safety Board.

There seemed to be fundamental problems with the Police in this regard. Pauline Procter that a FOI Request Process Document would follow after Tuddenham PC received their current FOI reply.

4. To approve minutes from the meeting held on 29th July 2020.

The minutes of the SAVID meeting dated 29th July 2020 were agreed as a true record and would be signed by the chair, scanned and sent to the secretary.

5. Matters arising not covered by this agenda.

Chair reported that it was disappointing that David Chenery was not in attendance to follow up his points from the previous minutes.

6. Treasurer's report

Colin Hedgley reported that the recent income received had been £100.00p donations each from Grundisburgh, Playford, Great Bealings, Little Bealings, Tuddenham and a pending BACS from Swilland and Witnesham GPC which would appear on the next bank statement. Total £600.

The current balance was £1123.50p but adding the £100 from SWgPC it was £1223.50p.

Online banking application was turning out to be a long process, but progressing.

7. SAVID Tool Kit.

- a) Update – Pauline Procter would forward the Gloucestershire Document to Mike Mottram and ask what SCC are already doing like Gloucestershire CC.**
- b) Road Safety Week November 16th-22nd – Various ideas were mentioned including a poster competition for the local schools in our parishes, it might be a better to approach PTA's as well as schools and perhaps use local media e.g. Fynn Lark News. It was agreed that Pauline Procter, Andrew Jolliffe and Tony Fryatt could continue the discussion outside of the meeting to include Iain Wilson and Mike Mottram Road Safety SCC.**

8. Purchase and use of SID/VAS equipment update.

The shared SID had been with Tuddenham and it was time to transfer to Grundisburgh next week.

9. SAVID web-site.

It was agreed to have a link on SAVID home page for Road Safety Week event. Bob Crouch asked if there was a hit counter on the site. Secretary would follow these points up and implement as appropriate. Secretary asked if Burgh were still SAVID members. Pauline Procter would write to Ed Creasey. Pauline Procter asked how up to date the SAVID Parish Members Grid was on the website. **Secretary would reissue the current grid to all members and ask for updates to be amended, then re-publish.**

10. Date of next meeting and items to be raised.

It was proposed and agreed that the next SAVID meeting would be Thursday 10th December, 18:30 via Zoom.

It was agreed to add an agenda item for the next meeting to cancel an AGM this year due to C19.

It was agreed to pursue David Chenery to attend the next meeting.
